Warm-up and Objective Discussion								
 Review activity on Nearpod.com. In nearpod.com, ask three collaborative questions: 1. list the numbers 1-10, 2. list the days of the week, 3. list the fruits you have learned. Divide ss to three groups. Each group answers one question. Go over all three activities in class. Show the picture of a butterfly. Ask students where the butterfly comes from. Tell students today we will read a story describing how a caterpillar feeds himself and then changes into beautiful butterfly. Tell them to read the story carefully and they will create their own story using the Adobe Spark Video.

 Call a student to act out the word "eat". Have the other ss guess the meaning while the teacher says the word. Model the sentence: On Monday I eat three apples. Have students make their own sentences by using the same structure. Have students share with their partners. Call a few students to share their sentences in class.

- 1. Have the students work in group to create their own story using the sentence structure they learned. They will do the following activities:
